11 NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

11.1 Notices will be posted on the Official Notice Board located adjacent to reception.

12 CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 12.1 Changes to the schedule will be posted by 2000hrs on the day before they will take effect. Other changes will be posted before 0900hrs on the day they take effect.
- 12.2 Changes to the Sailing Instructions made afloat will be indicated by the display of Code Flag 3rd Substitute accompanied by two sound signals. This may be communicated orally.

13 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 13.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed on the official flagstaff at the club.
- 13.2 The Warning Signal will not be made less than 60 minutes after "AP" is lowered ashore. This changes RRS Race Signals "AP".

14 SAFETY - SIGN ON/OFF FOR RACING

- 14.1 Skippers shall sign on before leaving the shore and sign off on return to the shore using the provided link to their phones.
- 14.2 Failure to do so will result in a 3 point penalty in the last race of the day. Changes RRS A4.1.

15 AREAS THAT RANK AS OBSTRUCTIONS

15.1 While racing in Pittwater, boats shall not sail within the area of water between registered moorings (including Police or NSW Maritime moorings) and the adjacent shoreline inside Pittwater. These areas rank as obstructions.

16 SUPPORT BOATS

- 16.1 Support vessels shall monitor the VHF (ch72) during racing and shall render assistance to any boat in danger as requested the Race Committee.
- 16.2 Except when complying with SI14.1, support vessels and personnel shall stay 50m outside the course area from the time of the first Warning Signal until all boats have finished racing.

17 TIME LIMIT

- 17.1 The target time to sail the course is 30 minutes.
- 17.2 The time limit for each race shall be 50 minutes.
- 17.3 Boats failing to finish within 10 minutes after the first boat sails the course and finishes will be scored DNF. This changes RRS 35 and A4.

18 PENALTY SYSTEM

18.1 The penalty for breaking a rule of Part 2 shall be a One Turn Penalty, except that for infringements within the Zone, as defined in the RRS18, shall be a Two Turns Penalty. This changes RRS 44.1 and 44.2.

19 PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

- 19.1 The protest time limit is 60 minutes after the last boat finishes in the last race of that day.
- 19.2 Notices will be posted no later than 20 minutes after the protest time limit informing competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses.
- 19.3 The penalty, if any, for any infringement of the rules other than RRS Part 2 is at the sole discretion of the Protest Committee and may be other than disqualification. This changes RRS 64.1.
- 19.4 On the last day of the regatta a request for reopening a hearing or redress shall be delivered no later than 30 minutes after the decision was posted. Changes RRS 62.2.

20 CLASS FLAGS

20.1 The Class flag shall be the VX One Class Flag (VX One logo on white background).

21 MARKS, STARTING/FINISHING LINE

- 21.1 Mark 1 and the Gate marks shall be **yellow** inflatable buoys.
- 21.2 Mark 1a (the offset mark) shall be a green inflatable buoy.
- 21.3 The "Change Mark" shall be a **pink** inflatable buoy. When, in a subsequent change a new mark is replaced, it shall be replaced by an original **yellow** buoy.
- 21.4 The starting and finishing lines shall be between a staff displaying, an **orange** flag at the start and **blue** flag at the finish, on the Race Committee Signal Boat and a black and white checkered inflatable buoy.
- 21.5 The finishing vessel may be different to the starting vessel.

22 COURSES

- 22.1 The course, compass bearing and approximate distance to Mark 1 shall be displayed by the Race Committee Boat.
- 22.2 Marks 1 and 1a shall be rounded to port. Mark 1a, if laid, is an offset mark.
- 22.3 If one Gate mark is missing, boats shall round the existing mark to port.
- 22.4 Below is the description of the courses:

Code	Courses
C2	Course 2: Start - 1 - 1a - Finish
C4	Course 4: Start - 1 - 1a - 2s/2p - 1 - 1a - Finish
C6	Course 6: Start - 1 - 1a - 2s/2p - 1 - 1a - 2s/2p - 1 - 1a - Finish
